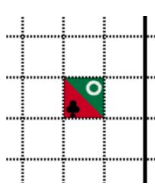
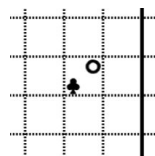
Symbols Explanation

Here is a breakdown of the symbols used. Each section includes a black & white symbol, and a colour symbol, as well as stitched examples. The upper stitched example is normal sized, and the lower is at twice the size.

Full Cross Stitch

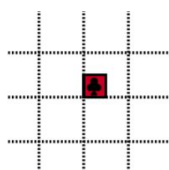
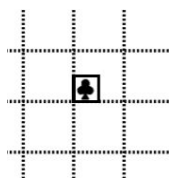


$\frac{3}{4}$ Stitch pair

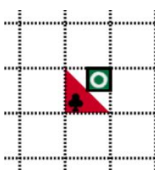
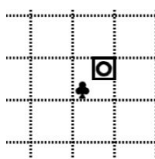


Quarter Stitch

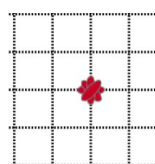
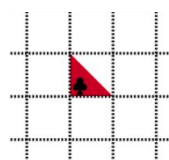
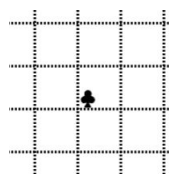
Note that the symbol is surrounded by a square
