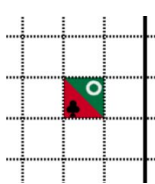
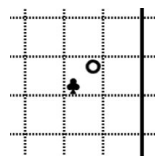
Symbols Explanation

Full Cross Stitch

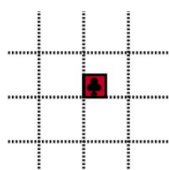
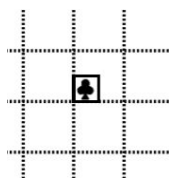


$\frac{3}{4}$ Stitch pair

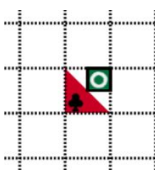
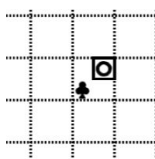


Quarter Stitch

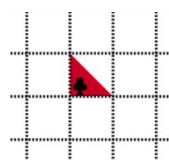
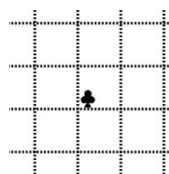

$\frac{3}{4}$ Stitch and Quarter Stitch

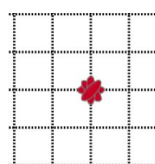


$\frac{3}{4}$ Stitch
